Dear Parent(s) and Carer(s),

Due to their additional needs, our students can sometimes find collaborative work extremely difficult and all of our staff were blown away with what the children achieved, which I believe was entirely because of your supportive environment and inspiring facilities.

The fact that at the end of the workshop one pupil asked "have you any work placements?" says everything! Thank you for allowing us to work at our own pace in such a high quality venue and I particularly appreciated how you helped guide our rehearsal and preparation when we needed support and structure. On our return journey the staff were all commenting on how fantastic you were as practitioners and how lucky we are to live as close as we do to your theatre.

Growing Together to support children's wellbeing

As life post pandemic begins to re-emerge and we begin to slowly return to normality, children's wellbeing may be taking up more of your thoughts than normal. The pandemic world we have all lived in will have meant that children have had to adapt quickly to changes in their immediate surroundings, as well as the wider world. Children's Mental Health Week commenced on Monday 7 February 2022 for the entire week. The theme of Children's Mental Health Week 2022 was 'growing together'. This explores the ways in which children and adults are encouraged to consider how they have grown and how they can help others to grow. Here at Church Lawton we believe that a child's wellbeing is crucial to their happiness, whether that is physical or related to children's mental health. The theme of 'growing together' works perfectly alongside our 'can do' ethos, which encourages children to be anything they want to be.

NCS

Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) it has since taken over half a million young people on the programme. By participating in NCS, students will work together to take on exciting challenges together. Whether that be in a lake, up a climbing wall, in the local community or practising first aid. All of these activities are just a taste of what NCS offers. The NCS allows young people to get their voices heard and make a difference in the local area.

Covid 19

The Government has updated their guidance in relation to Covid19 and how the country is going to move out of the pandemic. The Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, has set out the <u>next steps for living with COVID-19</u> in England from Friday 1 April 2022.

I have summarised the information below from Friday 1 April 2022:

COVID-19 symptoms

Pupils, staff and other adults stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>. The main symptoms of COVID-19 are a recent onset of any of the following:

- · a new continuous cough
- a high temperature
- a loss of, or change in, your normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature in line with the main symptoms of Covid-19 should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

Children and young people with COVID-19 should not attend their education setting while they are infectious. Parents and carers will agree that a student with the key symptoms or COVID-19 should not attend given the potential risk to others.

Avoid meeting people at higher risk of becoming seriously unwell from COVID-19, especially those with a severely weakened immune system, for the 10 days after your symptoms started

If you have COVID-19, stay at home and avoid contact with other people

If you have COVID-19 you can infect other people from 2 days before your symptoms start, and for up to 10 days after. You can pass on the infection to others, even if you have mild symptoms or no symptoms at all.

School Lunches - Price increase






Adventure Learning

Adventure Learning for students in Primary and Middle School this half-term has been horse riding at Courses for Horses. The students have shown real resilience and enthusiasm during this activity.

Students have learnt how to care for a horse, how to get on a horse and have enjoyed riding around the arena.









Our students in Secondary recently visited Stanley Head for their Adventure Learning this half-term. Students took part in orienteering and learnt the importance of using maps. In Art we have created cards for our marvellous Mums. In English, we have been learning about stories from Africa, and in Maths we have focused on subtraction in real world situations.

In Maths, students have been learning about fractions and shape and space. Students have been putting their problem-solving skills to the test during a Maths Puzzle Day.



Franklin have also been learning about significant historical figures. Students have started learning about London in their humanities lessons. In our I.C.T. lessons, students have all produced excellent slide shows on topics of interest to them.









Geography

Our topic on rivers has continued this term and we are drawing down on our geography skills and knowledge. We have looked at the water cycle and considered how water is important to us.



In Maths, we have continued to look at a range of skills, ratio and proportion and have tested our multiplication skills. We have also realised that knowing our times tables can help in other areas of Maths.

Art

In Art we are learning how to draw portraits. We have learnt some new skills and are now applying those to self portraits and portraits of each other.

Maths


We have been exploring number sequences, missing numbers, unknown values and ALGEBRA!

Our students always enjoy **PE**. They show great team spirit, particularly when playing Rugby.


















Nightingale

During the week of our Sponsored Reading Challenge, students read every morning. As well as books, this also included magazines, comics and newspapers.


















BRANSON
