Dear Parents and Carers, as always we are speeding through the terms and are fast approaching our final term of the year. The half term break is soon upon us and a warm and sunny welcome (don't look at the weather forecast) to the Whitsun newsletter from Church Lawton. I was hoping that we would have a settled period of weather as we move into this half term break, but it would appear that our climate is determined to show all weathers; we have had snow, hail, fog, thunderstorms, patchy rain and smattering of blue skies and sunshine, I can only hope the weather settles for prolonged sunny periods as we move into the next half of the summer term.

We have had a most interesting start to 2021 and although we have moved towards step 3 of the national lockdown easement from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> May we must, please, keep to our secure Covid systems which includes twice weekly Lateral Flow Testing for all staff and secondary aged students. We all remain hopeful for further easement as we potentially move to step 4, but a number of important factors must be met before this occurs.

This half term has been busy and extremely productive in terms of upper secondary and post 16 students completing their GCSE mock exams. Both students and staff are ensuring that the necessary information is ready for final submission to the exam's boards by June 28<sup>th</sup>. I have been extremely proud of the appreciation and understanding shown by all other students in the school in ensuring that areas around exams are quiet and noise free and which have allowed their peers the ability to concentrate and do their very best.

#### Reaseheath College

Students in our Key Stage 4 groups have continued to attend Reaseheath College in order to complete their studies within a range of subjects from Car Mechanics, Bricklaying and Plastering and Equine studies. The students have all worked tremendously hard. My sincere thanks to the staff at Reaseheath for their tutoring and to our staff who accompany and support these programmes.

#### **Adventure Learning**

We have been very fortunate to have been able to start exploring the local and wider community again, resuming our Adventure Learning programme at Clip and Climb. Students have faced a variety of different challenges each visit, some have personal

challenges to climb higher than before, others overcoming their fear of heights. The children are getting some unique experiences and have very wide smiles when they return from these adventures.

Other lessons have included a transport theme in Art & DT, hockey in PE, the Beach in Topic and Clip and Climb in Adventure Learning.








### franklin

Now that everyone is back in school, we have been able to settle into school routines again.

In German we have been watching the film 'Das Wunder von Bern' (the miracle of Bern) in German with English subtitles . Through this we have been learning about post-war German history and

culture as well as learning the language for different family members and their characteristics.

In Life Skills Gamma and Delta groups have been looking at how to catch a bus and how to read a timetable. We have also been learning how to sew on a button and how to use a range of cleaning

equipment. I am sure you all have sparkling clean homes as a result of this!

In Science the Gamma and Delta groups have started learning about solids, liquids and gases. They have been able to provide lots of interesting facts about particles and the density of different objects.

Delta is studying the book 'Treasure Island' in English and have been discussing the characters as they unfold in the story.

Gamma have been working on their comprehension skills and have enjoyed working with our new additional English teacher, Miss Owens.

In Geography we have moved on to learning about the weather. We made our own rain gauges and put them out on the MUGA to measure how much rainfall there was in a week. The recent downpours have aided our research.



Students have continued to show their Maths skills in algebra this half term. We have also welcomed Mr Shaw to our Maths team who has been particularly good at creating bespoke lessons, for example we had a Metallica Maths lesson one day.

We have continued to enjoy our gardening club on Wednesday afternoons. Our seeds have now flourished into young plants which are now braving the elements (and the rabbits!) on the sensory field. Our water butt has collected a great deal of rainwater and students have been given the responsibility of watering the plants. By the end of this term we should have a yield of potatoes, raspberries, peas, beans and flowers. We are big on being environmentally aware and have used some old sieves to make hanging baskets.

If anyone has any spare gardening equipment, seeds, plants or any other garden related items these would be more than gratefully received.






Austen have been very busy this half term.

Luke has been sanding and varnishing real wood coasters. Ellie has been making homemade dog toys and Alfie has been following patterns to make cushions.




